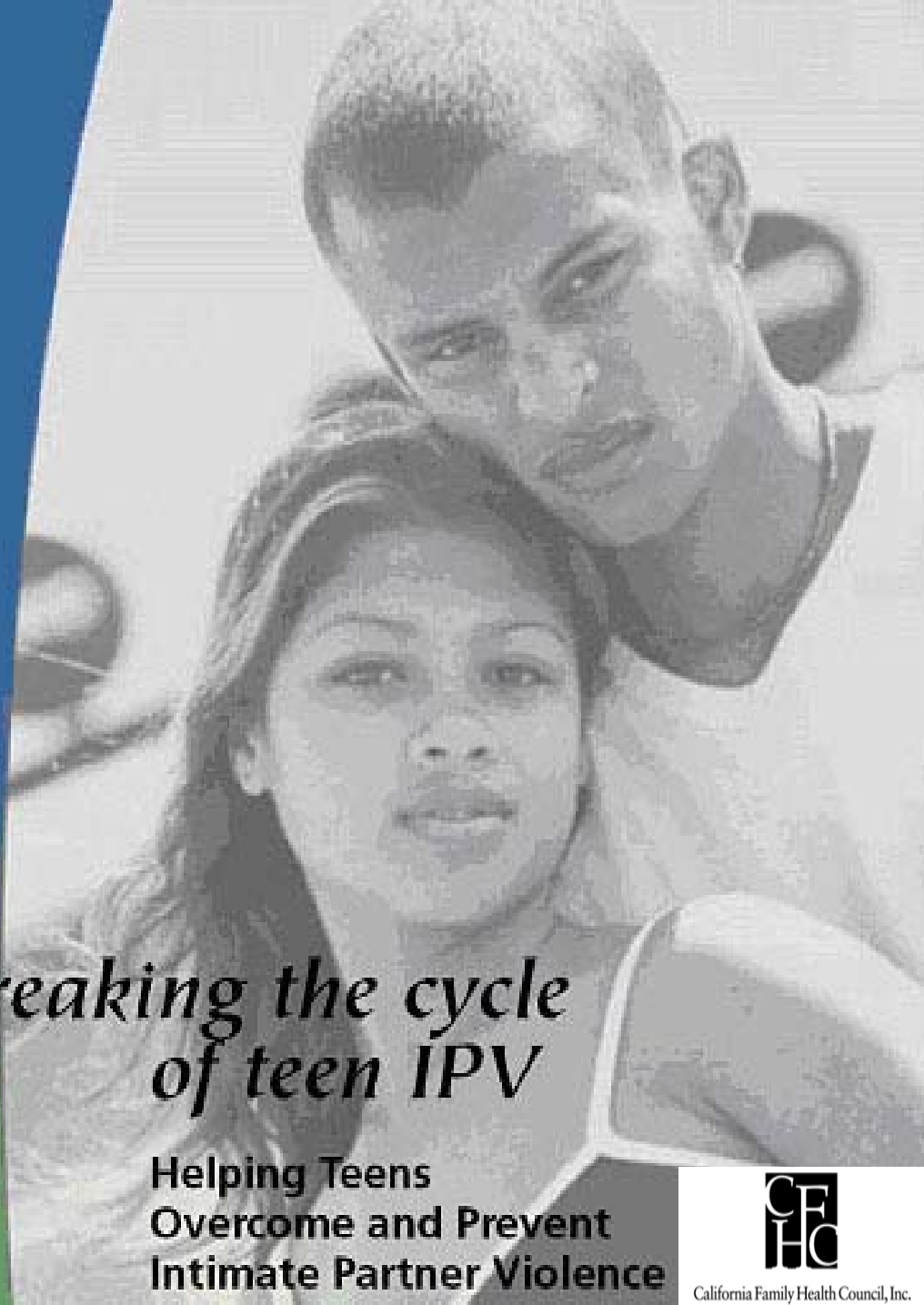

Core Values / Beliefs of Today's Session

- **Intervention – Specific services to provide support or find immediate solutions to identified problems/issues.**
